

- Build relationships: Connect with your preceptor, other students on your rotation, and healthcare professionals in the pharmacy. These



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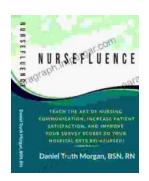
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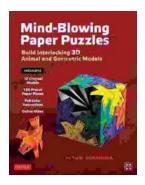
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
