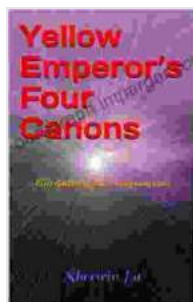

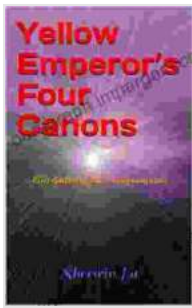

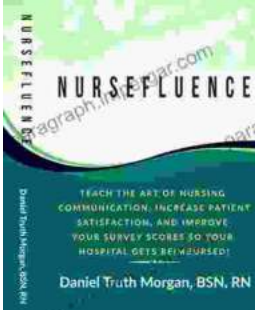

Yellow Emperor's Four Canons: 1973 discovery from Han dynasty tomb

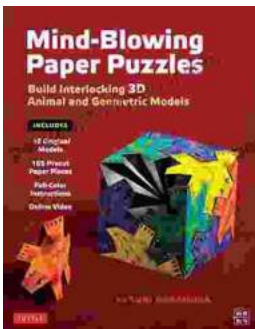
